56% of teens admitted to talking on the phone while driving



20% of teens have an accident in their first year of driving

The Teen Driving Pledge

Don't be a statistic. Make safety a priority.

By checking each box, you are making a promise to yourself, your family, and your friends to drive safely, obey the law, and obey your parents.

- I will not talk or text on the phone.
- I will not utilize social media apps such as Snapchat, Instagram, or Twitter.
- I will always wear my seat belt.
- I will always make my friends and other passengers wear their seat belts.
- I will obey the speed limit and understand that speeding does not get me anywhere that much faster.
- I will drive alone or with only one friend as to not add more distractions.
- I won't change the music while driving. Instead, I will turn on the radio, music playlist, or podcast before I start driving.
- I understand that yellow lights mean caution, not speed up.
- If I am in a friend's car and feel unsafe, I will speak up!
- If I get into an accident or get a ticket, I will tell my parents.
